

In My Father's Words: The Story of an Auschwitz Survivor

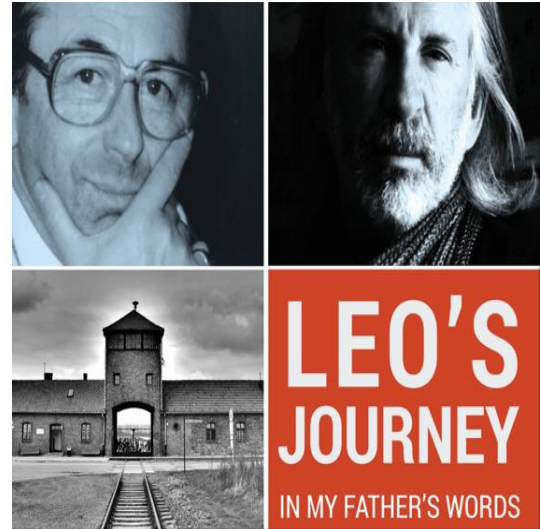
On January 27, 1945 at 4:30pm, the Nazi concentration camp Auschwitz-Birkenau was liberated. "Leo's Journey" is an extraordinary story about a 15-year-old boy named Leopold Lowy and his struggle to survive the notorious Twin Experiments that took place at Auschwitz-Birkenau under Josef Mengele.

Leo passed away in 2002, but his story is respectfully told by his son Richard. "Leo's Journey" provides a rare opportunity to hear a first-hand, word-for-word account of a story of human experimentation in a concentration camp responsible for the death of nearly 1.1 million people, including nearly one million Jews.

"In My Father's Words", based on the documentary "Leo's Journey", takes you on the harrowing journey of Leo's incredible story of survival in Auschwitz.
